SYLLABUS

This course provides an opportunity to write a research paper informed by students' internship experiences. Students who take POL193 after taking POL192 will write a 10 page paper (with at least 8 academic sources). Students who take POL193 concurrently with POL192 will write one paper for POL192 and POL193. Students taking POL192A or POL192B with POL193 will write a 16 page paper (with at least 10 sources). Students taking POL192A and POL192B with POL193 will write a 20 page paper (with at least 10 sources).

Timelines

For students taking POL193 after taking POL192:

1. By 10/8: meet with the TA to discuss possible areas of research. Students should also give copies of their 192 papers to the TA.
2. By 10/19: write a short description of the paper topic and put together an annotated bibliography with at least 8 sources from the political science research literature. Email both to the TA and schedule a meeting with TA.
3. During the week of 10/22: meet with the TA to discuss paper topic and annotated bibliography.
4. By 11/9: write a rough draft of the final paper. E-mail the draft to the TA.
5. During the week of 11/12: meet with the TA to discuss rough draft.
6. 12/3: final paper due. Late papers will be penalized a letter grade per day.

For students taking POL193 concurrently with POL192:
